

THE CITY OF BATH

The City of Bath is in the County of Somerset, 104 miles west of London, boasts the only natural hot springs in the United Kingdom. The constructed baths and a shrine there, naming it Aquae Sulis. During the Georgian age, it became a fashionable spa resort, which left a legacy of excellent Georgian architecture hewn from Bath Stone. Bath has been a World Heritage Site since 1987, and is home to many museums, theatres, and other sporting and cultural venues. Its architecture illustrates its long history, from the Roman baths with their considerable Celtic influence to the Royal Crescent, Bath Abbey, and Thermae Bath Spa.

NEAREST AIRPORTS

Bristol airport is some 21 miles from the City of Bath.

London Heathrow is some 104 miles from the City of Bath.

London Gatwick is some 131 miles from the City of Bath.

Manchester airport is some 171 miles from the City of Bath.
